



UPHOLSTERY CARE

- Regular vacuuming of your upholstered furniture will enhance the beauty and longevity.
- Treat spills promptly. **GENTLY BLOT** away spill with a clean, dry absorbent cloth. **DO NOT RUB.**
- Remove dried contaminants with a soft brush or dull knife prior to wet treatment.

IMPORTANT! TEST A SMALL HIDDEN SECTION OF THE UPHOLSTERY TO ENSURE FABRIC AND COLOR ARE NOT AFFECTED. FOR SEVERE STAINS, CONSULT A PROFESSIONAL UPHOLSTERY CLEANER.

CLEANING METHODS

While all stains may not be fully removed, these methods are suggested for best results.

- A** Use a water-based soap solution of 1 tablespoon of laundry detergent per 2 cups of warm water. Dampen the cleaning cloth and **GENTLY BLOT** away the spill. **DO NOT RUB.** Rotate the cleaning cloth often and rinse with water to ensure complete removal of all soap residue.
- B** Use a mild solvent-based residential upholstery cleaner and follow the manufacturer’s instructions.
- C** Mix ½ cup bleach, 2 TBS mild soap in a gallon of warm water. Dampen cleaning cloth with solution and blot away the stain. Rinse thoroughly. Blot dry or allow to air dry.

CONTAMINANT	CLEANING METHOD (SEE ABOVE)
Chocolate, Coffee, Tea, Juice	A with tepid water
Fruit	A with cold water
Ink	A with rubbing alcohol
Milk, Wine, Soft Drinks	A
Grease, Oil, Lipstick	B
Wax	Brush first, then B
Vomit	Lift with cold water sponge, then A
Urine	A
Pencil	B followed by A
Mud	Lift off, vacuum, then A
Algae, Mold, Mildew, Stubborn stains	C

AND MANY MORE COMMON STAINS.
